## Turning a Clock

To begin with here's credit to Steve Jones from Solihull: "My workshop is in Redditch. There are lots doing them now as well. Regards Steve"

Type of wood to choose

Pieces:

6-7"X1.5"

4-5"X1.5"

6"X1.5"

3-4"X1.5"

Base, top, spindle and finial

All connected with 3/8" tenons and holes

Base:

Start with the piece in some Cole jaws and slant the bottom in so it sits on the rim Cut recess for Chuck to hold Sand, finish and flip onto 50mm chuck jaws Profile base, sand and finish

Head:

Start by grabbing with 100mm jaws and work on hole 2 5/8 Forster gives you perfect measure for the 2 3/4" face.

Cut It (or drill it) 3/4" deep

Test fit

Sand face and finish.

Flip and grab inside with 50mm jaws

Back and sides, sand and finish...

Talk about options

Line in center for holes

Align grain, drill holes

Spindle:

Turn between centers

Mark tenons

Turn ends with easy beader

Mark center for ornament

Cut ornament

Cove remainder

Sand

Finish

Size tenons

Finial:

Get round then grab securely with pin jaws Mark off tenon, cove, and the rest is onion and finial Sand, finish, remove. Glue together.
