Leonard Hartline brought in a tiny lidded vessel made from deer antler. It was about 1/2 inch in diameter and had a copper thimble on the lid. He also brought in a fairly large black oak burl multi axis turned piece. This sculptural piece was turned on 5 axis and finished with wood turners finish. Randy Glasgow brought in a sassafras burl vessel that he had also finished with wood turners finish. Gary Johnson brought in a Box Elder bowl with crotch figure finished with Master Gel. Gary also showed an elliptical walnut bowl turned from a 4 inch diameter half log.

# Program

This month's demonstration was on making contemporary teapots. Our three demonstrators, Leonard Hartline, Binh Pho, and Randy Glasco had attended a class at Arrowmont given by Michael Hosaluk, A series of pictures that were taken at that class were passed around for all to see. This demonstration could almost be called a three ring circus because all three demonstrators were turning all at once.

Binh turned a body from a piece of cedar. To save time he hollowed this out in two pieces and then glued the pieces back together, much like Clay Foster had demonstrated at our Joy of Turning Symposium last year.

Leonard and Randy turned the hollowed pieces required for the spout and for the legs. These pieces were then cut at angles on the band saw and glued back together to form the necessary shapes and joints.

Randy Glasco showed an interesting tool made from an open end wrench. The edge of the wrench was sharpened and this is used as a sizing tool for cutting and final sizing of tenons on various parts such as legs or spouts.

Thanks to all three for sharing this fun project with us.
