August Demos: Green Wood Pre- and Post Turning & The Wood-Cut Bowlsaver



Lloyd Richardson demonstrated the Woodcut Bowlsaver. This device allows the turner to harvest several rough turned bowls from one blank. Lloyd researched similar products and found the Bowlsaver to be the best match for his time requirements and skill-set as an amateur turner. And, he found the demonstration video very helpful.

The Bowlsaver mounts onto the lathe using both the tool rest and tailstock. Once set up the Bowlsaver is easy to operate, and requires only steady, gentle pressure on the knife's operating. Frequent withdrawal of the knife from the blank is necessary to prevent wood shavings from building up that may jamb the knife and create heat.

When laying out the daughter bowls on the face of the mother bowls, the turner should have a rough wall thickness of about 1 inch and allow for the thickness of the knife blade at each cut.

Lloyd keeps the lathe at 400 rpm for safety. The instructions say 600 rpm but Lloyd explained that the size, weight and balance of the blank are key factors in choosing speed. He also uses a laser pointer to trace the knife's path through the blank so he can determine the bottom thickness of his bowls. The manufacturer's instructions say the knife's replaceable cutting tip should last for 500 bowls. The hollow grind on the tip is es-



sential. Lloyd recommends a parallel grind for softwood and a negative 5 degree grind for hardwood. See the manufacturer's website: www.shop.woodcuttools.com for more information, including the downloadable video.

Gary Hinegardner conducted the pre-meeting in Dave Endres' absence. He repeated an earlier program on chainsaw safety, types of chains, sharpening and other tools useful for cutting rough blanks. He demonstrated how to cut blanks from logs and make them ready for the bandsaw or lathe, including his "planing" cut. He discussed wood shrinkage, storing green wood, sacking and end-sealing. He discussed choosing wood and had samples of walnut, cedar, hackberry, catalpa and white oak.

In addition to Lloyd's bowlsaver demo, Gary, Dave Baer and Walt Ahlgrim led a discussion on caring for green wood (Cont'd on page 3, see "gren")


