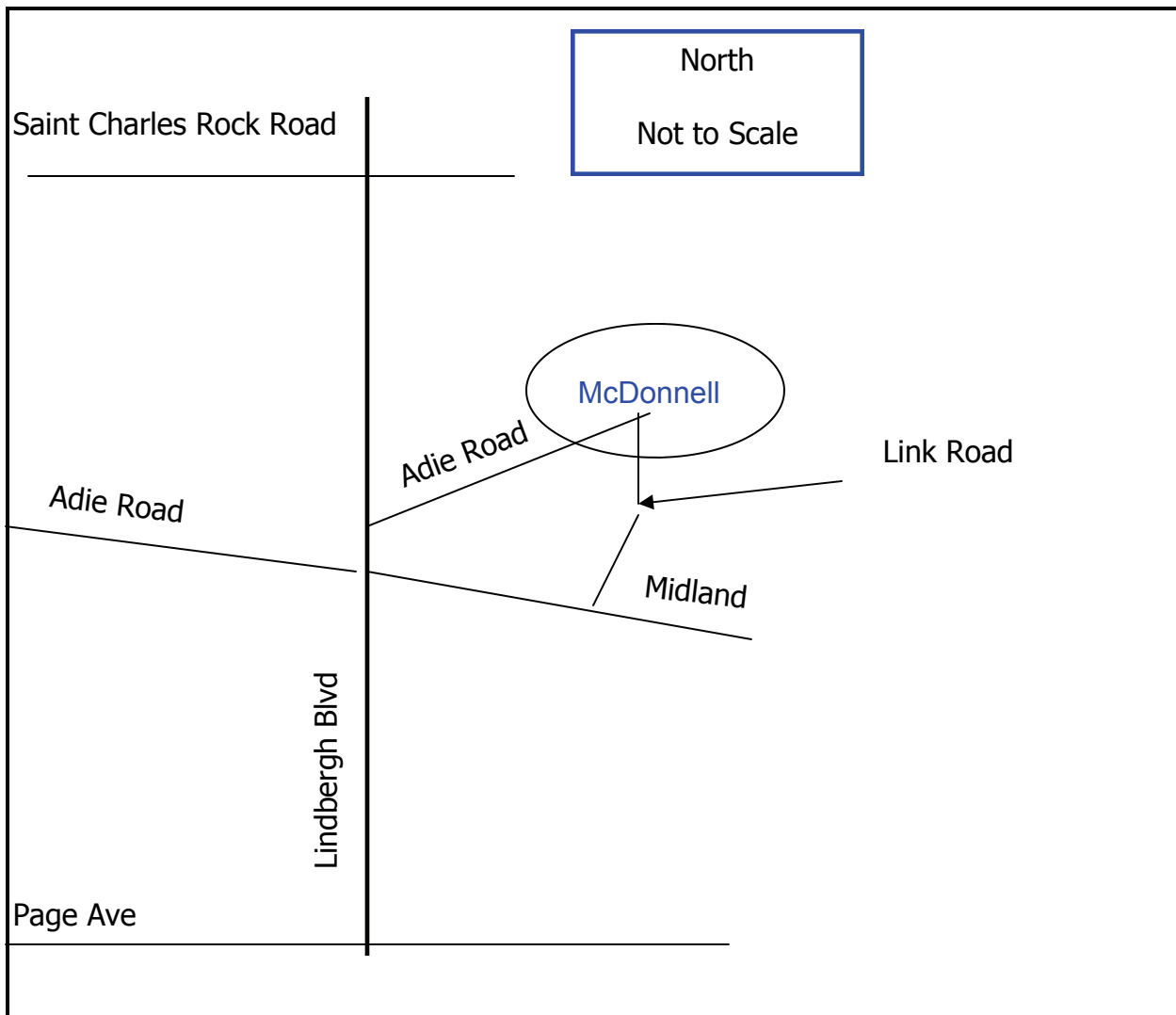

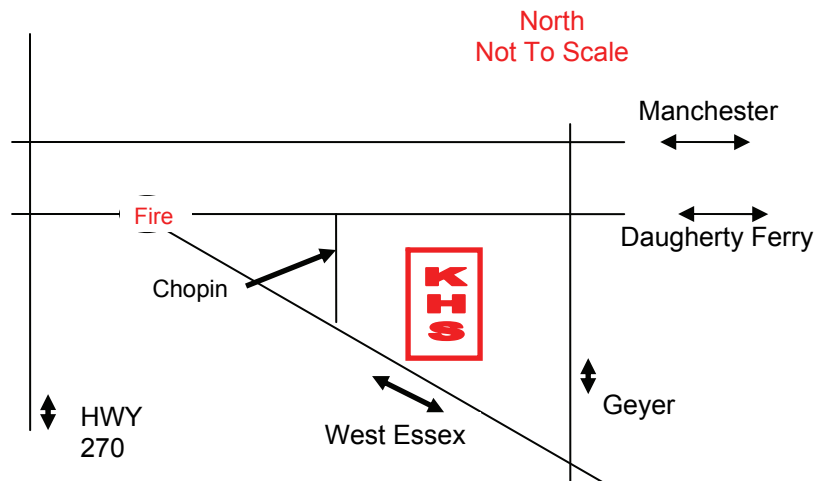

KHS is located on a very large campus, which includes several sports fields and several buildings. The main entrance and auditorium are located on West Essex. The official address is off of Essex. (South)

The best way to find KHS is to go to Highway 270 and Dougherty Ferry Road. DF is the first road south of Manchester road on Highway 270. Take Dougherty Ferry Road East to West Essex. The intersection is marked by a fire station which looks like a castle. If you miss West Essex, you will still see KHS from Daugherty Ferry, but you will be on the back (North) side. The main entrance and auditorium are located off of West Essex. Parking is immediately in front of the entrance.

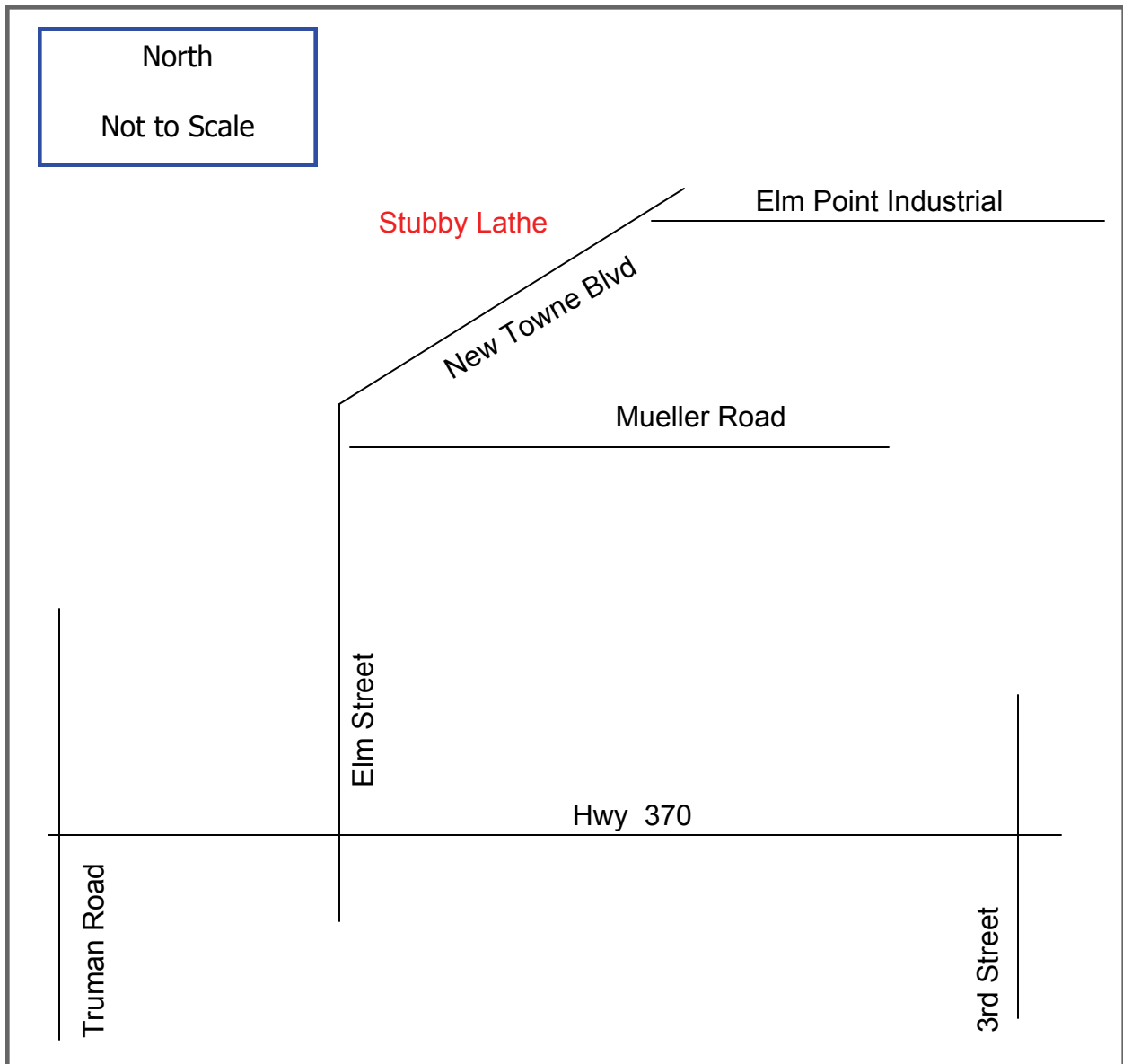

Jimmy Clewes Hands On Materials List

Lathe : heavy variable speed lathe (at least 12 inch swing over the bed)

Grinder: grinder with Oneway Vari-grind attachment

An Electric power drill for sanding

Vicmarc VM 100 (first choice) or Oneway chuck (Talon)

Denatured Alcohol

Sanding sealer (any make or type),

If Colouring a Spray sanding sealer.

An oil finish, Watco, or similar

Plastic cups for mixing colours

Tin of PasteWax (any make)

Wood for Demos

Oriental box

Ash , Beech , Elm , Maple or any other native timber for thesizes 10" long x 2 1/2 " deep x 4 " wide for base

And for the lid 5" long x 3 1/4 " wide x 2 1/2 deep , same wood for lid.

Colored Piece

Rippled or figured Sycamore or maple (must be figured!!!) 12" Dia x 2" to 2 1/2 " thick let me know if there is a problem with this.

(Ash will do as an alternative)

Arabic Box

Native wood (dry) 3 " x 3 " x 6 inches long

Long Stemmed Goblet

Dry Wood , 2 1/2 inch square x 11 inches long , Maple , Walnut, or Similar in density

Natural Edged End Grain Vase

Log of wet Ash, Elm, and Native timber? Approx 6 " dia x 10" long

Design shape form and Aesthetics demo

2 pieces of dry wood maple or similar

8 inches dia x 2 inches thick.

Back to Basics Bowl Turning showing Tool and process Technique

A Bowl Blank 10 inches dia x 4 inches thick or similar size.
