August Demo – Turning Spheres by Jon Spelbring & Bob Espy ● Thanks to Jon and Bob for



demonstrating a couple of techniques to turn a sphere (just in time for the club Bocci tournament in Sept). Jon's technique was to turn the cylinder, then flip it (between centers) so that the end grain is facing you; use a parting tool to cut a groove; back to normal orientation; then just turn until the groove is gone using the ghost images as a guide. August Pre Meeting Demo – Sanding by Walt Ahlgrim ● Most of us do not like to sand our work but we typically end up doing at least some. Thanks to Walt for providing tips on effective sanding. Keep your lathe speed slow so that your sandpaper follows the peaks and valleys. Slow speeds will also help keep your turning cooler, prevent heat cracks, and reduce paper clogging. Final sanding should be with the grain. And treat your sandpaper (as Matt has told us) like someone else gives it to you; meaning replace it often. Remember that worn down 120 grit is not the same as 220 grit. It is just worn out sand paper. You may also want to try the metallic open weave materials. They are very effective. The open weave cuts quickly and can be shaken/blown clean of material for extended life.
