I think it will not only be a terrific help for beginners, but I think even our experienced turners will benefit from a good review of the basics. I know I will. Thanks to Bill Farny for presenting the kick off session in January. We will be looking to our experienced members to help present this material in future meetings, so please let me know when you would be available to help with the training. It is very important that we all turn safely and that we encourage and train new members in the proper use of turning tools.




