New President's Spin ● Please allow me to begin my introduction by saying how honored I am to be the club's new president. Bob Goulding and Charlie Sapp have done a tremendous job in keeping the club on tract and expanding with new associations and woodturning learning. Charlie, you are one of the toughest acts I've ever had to follow, and I will do my very best to add to our club in as many ways as I can.

I joined the club in 2015 at the suggestion of Charlie Yonk. Standing in the parking lot at Rockler, Charlie had to show me his latest wooden bowl, a beautiful segmented number I still remember to this day. He suggested I join the gang on Sundays and meet some of the area's other wood turners. I will never regret having taken that step.

So, who am I?

John Hoeing spent his post-graduate career as either controller or chief financial officer for various real estate companies beginning in 1980.
