Jon presented a very informative lesson on using the skew chisel and then allowed attendees to practice.








January Meeting: Jon Spelbring turning a Twice Turned Disc Vase:

Re-Turning to the Community •

Nursing Home Project: A new community service project for our members is to make small lidded boxes for individuals in nursing homes. Approximate dimension should be no larger than 3X3 with loose fitting lids. Once we get 30 or more we will deliver them to a nursing home. If you have suggestions for the nursing home, please let Laura know. This will be an ongoing project for 2020.

Pens for the Troops ● Since 2004 over 175,000 pens have been crafted for the troops thru Woodcraft's Turn for the Troops program. The pens are sent to active duty or recovering military personnel across the globe. In 2018 WTSTL club members turned 30 pens; in 2019 you turned 40 pens; and our goal for 2020 is to turn 50 pens for the program. See Treasurer, Charles Sapp, if you would like to get a pen kit to participate in the program. There is a \$3 deposit for the pen kit but it is refunded when the completed pen is returned. Please bring your completed pens for the troops to the Sept picnic or Oct meeting. They will be delivered to Woodcraft before Veterans Day for distribution to the services.

Beads of Courage — Our support for the Beads of Courage program continues with boxes going to Children's Hospital. Check out their link or talk to Ken Bald for more information.

Demos — We are looking to do demos at school fairs and church bazaars. This is a good way for our club to get out into the public eye for education and possibly for us to earn finances. The Tennessee Association of Woodturners (TAW) sponsors one of the longest running regional annual woodturning symposiums. Each year in January the TAW brings in some of the top woodturners from the nation for two days of woodturning demonstrations, vendor tradeshow and Saturday night banquet and auction.

I've attended this symposium for the last two years and have left with new ideas and techniques. This year Eric Lofstrom, demonstrator, showed me some new ways to use the skew and I hope to try some of his techniques. Cindy Drozda demonstrated the turning of lidded boxes with emphasis on turning long thin finials. I hope some of my boxes and Christmas ornaments will soon show improved finials. Mark St. Leger demonstrated the turning of a "rock-a-bye" box.


